### PROPOSAL A: ARE WE BETTER OFF? A TEN-YEAR ANALYSIS 1993-94 THROUGH 2003-04

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#### INTRODUCTION

The answer to the question, "Are we better off under Proposal A<sup>1</sup>?" depends on who "we" are. School districts? Homeowners? Business property owners? Consumers? Not only that, but the questions of *which* school districts, *which* homeowners, *which* business property owners, and *which* consumers need to be examined. This issue paper analyzes how school districts have fared under Proposal A, and includes a discussion of property owner taxation changes over the 1993-94 through 2003-04 time period as well.

#### PART I: PROPOSAL A ITSELF

In brief, before the 1994-95 fiscal year (FY), schools in Michigan were funded 69% via local property taxes and 31% by the State. Beginning with FY 1994-95, that funding ratio inverted, with the State providing 80% of total K-12 funding, and local revenue generating 20%. Also, schools now receive dollars for each student entering their doors, rather than relying heavily on property tax revenue. A detailed discussion of pre- and post-Proposal A funding sources, funding mechanisms, and revenue changes can be found in the paper, "School Finance in Michigan Before and After the Implementation of Proposal A: A Comparison of FY 1993-94 and FY 1994-95 Approaches to K-12 School Funding in Michigan".<sup>2</sup>

The shift away from property taxes as the primary school funding source under Proposal A was generated by three major changes: 1) a reduction in school property tax rates (mills); 2) a capping of the annual growth rate in property values subject to the property tax; and 3) increased reliance on income, sales, and tobacco taxes to fund K-12 education. School property tax millage rates (tax in dollars per \$1,000 of taxable value) were reduced under Proposal A from about 33 mills to 6 mills for owner-occupied property and to 24 mills for most other property. In addition, before Proposal A, property owners were taxed on one-half of the market value of their property (called the State equalized valuation (SEV)), which could grow uncapped based on real estate or business conditions.

After Proposal A was adopted, SEV could still grow uncapped, but it was no longer the basis for taxation. Instead, the property tax now is assessed on taxable value, which caps the annual growth in the value of each property to the rate of inflation or 5%, whichever is less. This cap on the annual taxable growth rate can produce a significant difference between a property's taxable value and SEV over time, and therefore has significantly reduced school and all other property taxes from what they otherwise would have been. (The cap on the taxable value growth rate is explained in more detail in Part IV.) The combination of the assessment cap and the reduction in school property tax rates has greatly reduced school operating property taxes.

To balance the decreased reliance on local property taxes as a basis for school district operating revenue, the sales and use taxes were increased from 4% to 6%, and a portion of the income tax was dedicated to the School Aid Fund (SAF). The cigarette tax also was increased, with a significant dedication to the SAF, and a new State education tax (six mills on all property) and real estate transfer tax (0.75% on the selling price) were implemented.

#### **PART II: THE ASSUMPTIONS**

The analysis of how school districts have fared under Proposal A and the attempt to answer the question, "Would districts be better off without Proposal A?" are based on several key assumptions. An appendix at the end of this paper provides further detail, but the major assumptions are highlighted here. The analysis produces a hypothetical operating revenue scenario in the current year *if* Proposal A had not been adopted, and compares that level of revenue, by each school district, with its actual payments in the current year.

First, school aid payments to districts were inflated from the 1993-94 levels (the year immediately before Proposal A was implemented) by the estimated percentage growth rate in what the SAF revenue would have been had the Fund *not* experienced any of the revenue changes mentioned above (e.g., sales tax is assumed to have remained at 4%), adjusted slightly for an assumption in General Fund (GF) contributions to the K-12 budget. The growth in the earmarked revenue to the SAF from 1993-94 through 2003-04 without Proposal A changes is estimated at 48%. Separately, the General Fund contribution to K-12 in 1993-94 was \$716.6 million, or 9% of entire GF revenue. Assuming that the GF contribution to the SAF would remain at 9% today, if Proposal A had not occurred, yields a \$793 million contribution. Combining these assumptions of SAF revenue growth and GF contribution to the K-12 budget produces a 40% increase to apply to each district's 1993-94 State Aid payments to determine an estimated 2003-04 State Aid payment.

Second, since SEV data are no longer collected at the school district level but are collected at the local unit of government level, districts' 1993-94 SEV data were inflated by the same percentage increase in SEV experienced by the local unit that collected the data, over the 10-year period. This yields an estimate for each district's 2003-04 SEV, which is needed for an analysis of hypothetical local revenue to be generated today, if Proposal A had not occurred.

Third, mills levied in 1993-94 are assumed to be at the same level in 2003-04. This assumption is made for two reasons: 1) It is impossible to predict if, when, and by how much voters would have been willing to adopt millage increases; and 2) Headlee rollbacks<sup>3</sup> are not assumed in the analysis. Excluding Headlee rollbacks of millage rates from the analysis provides some leeway for offsetting millage increases that may have occurred.

#### PART III: THE ANALYSIS OF SCHOOL DISTRICTS

#### **School District Groupings**

Given the assumptions listed above and those detailed in the Appendix, the analysis concludes that out of 553 school districts, 28 are "better off" with Proposal A and 525 are "worse off" in terms of combined State and local revenue. Essentially, this means that comparing actual 2003-04 State Aid payments plus districts' actual 2003-04 local property tax revenue with estimated State payments and local revenue if Proposal A had not happened, yields less money for 95% of the districts.

The 28 districts that are "better off" with Proposal A had either relatively small growth in SEV over the last 10 years, or large growth in their per-pupil foundation allowances. Further, 24 of the 28 had

gains in enrollment. Since Proposal A moved operational funding to a per-pupil basis, districts with increasing enrollments fare better than those with declining enrollments, all else being equal. Additional per-pupil revenue for districts in this group ranged from \$11 to \$3,283 when compared with estimated payments had Proposal A not occurred.

In order to take a deeper look at the school districts that are "worse off" under Proposal A, they can be divided into various groupings based on the magnitude of their revenue foregone as a result of Proposal A and as estimated under this analysis.

<u>Table 1</u> divides the 525 school districts that are "worse off" (i.e., receive less revenue under current law) into five groups, each of which includes 105 districts. The categories include the range of revenue foregone on a per-pupil basis, the percentage growth in the districts' per-pupil funding, from the base year of 1993-94 through 2003-04, and the number of districts in each group with declining enrollment. Since 1994-95, the basic foundation grant has grown by \$1,700, or 34%. The *minimum* funding level has grown by 60%, and if the base year (1993-94) is included, the funding level for the "poorest" per-pupil revenue district has grown by 143%. One might anticipate that a large percentage growth in per-pupil funding under Proposal A would mitigate the losses.

<u>Table 1</u> would seem to indicate that enrollment has played a larger part in determining how a district's revenue has fared under Proposal A than the growth in the foundation allowance. This is evidenced by two factors: 1) The downward trend in the last column in the table means that the "best-faring" districts (though still with less revenue than if Proposal A had not occurred) tend to include those with increasing enrollments, rather than declining enrollments; and, 2) large growth rates in the foundation allowance (shown in the middle column) do not strictly correlate with where districts align in the quintiles.

#### **Declining Enrollment?**

Proposal A changed the way schools are funded from a property tax revenue structure to a *perpupil* basis. Therefore, all else being equal, a district that sees reduced pupils will see less funds as well. The reader may ask, "Could declining enrollment itself cause a district to receive less revenue

under Proposal A than if Proposal A had not occurred?" To test this hypothesis, a further assumption holds pupils at the same level in 2003-04 as in 1993-94, and the following results occur:

- 1. Twenty-one districts are worse off under Proposal A *strictly because* of declining enrollment. In other words, if the districts had the same level of pupils today as in 1993-94, more revenue would have been generated under Proposal A than without it, but using current pupils generates less revenue under current law than without Proposal A.
- 2. Eighteen districts are better off under Proposal A *strictly because* of increasing enrollment. In these cases, holding the districts at the 1993-94 pupil levels would have generated less revenue under Proposal A than without it, but using 2003-04 pupils generates higher revenue under Proposal A than without it.
- 3. Although 262 districts had increasing enrollment, it was not enough to offset the caps on SEV and mills and the districts are therefore worse off under Proposal A even with increasing enrollment.
- 4. Although 242 districts had declining enrollment, they would remain worse off under Proposal A even holding pupils constant.
- 5. Four districts had declining enrollment, but increases in their foundation allowances more than made up for the pupil declines and therefore the districts are better off under Proposal A even with declining enrollment.
- 6. Six districts fared better under Proposal A and had increasing enrollment, but would remain better off even holding pupils constant.

Therefore, holding pupils constant and disregarding districts' growth or reduction do not have a large impact on the analysis of how districts have fared under Proposal A. Even assuming the same pupils as in 1993-94, the vast majority of districts would have had more operational revenue without Proposal A. Again, this analysis rests upon an assumption that mills would be the same today as in 1993, which would have placed on school districts the burden of petitioning for continued high millage rates as SEV grew over time.

<u>Table 2</u> illustrates how the five largest-population school districts in Michigan have fared under Proposal A assuming that the districts have the same students now as in FY 1993-94. By making this assumption, the effects of enrollment changes are eliminated in order to focus solely on the taxation aspects of Proposal A.

#### PART IV: THE ANALYSIS OF TAXATION OF PROPERTY OWNERS


The quick answer to why most districts would see increased revenue had Proposal A not occurred is that, Statewide, SEV more than doubled over the past 10 years, but SEV is no longer the basis for school district operating revenue. One of Proposal A's primary objectives was to lower property taxes, and this was accomplished by both lowering mills and capping the assessment growth rate. The following example illustrates the dramatic changes in property taxation that supports school operations.

In 1993-94, the average school district operational millage rate was 33 mills. Therefore, an owner of a home with a market value of \$100,000 would have had an SEV of \$50,000, and would have paid, on average, \$1,650 in school district operational taxes. The market value of the same home in 2003-04 is estimated at \$190,800, with an SEV of \$95,400. If Proposal A had not occurred, and mills stayed constant, this homeowner would be paying \$3,148 in school operating taxes, an increase of 91% over 1993-94. Instead, Proposal A capped the yearly growth rate of taxable value to the lesser of the rate of inflation or 5%. The same home's *taxable value* in 2003-04 is estimated at \$63,745 (assuming no change in ownership<sup>4</sup>). Operating millage rates on homes are now (in most cases) six mills, rather than the 33 mills averaged 10 years ago. Applying six mills to the taxable value of this home yields a current-year tax bill of \$382 to support the operations of the local school district, or a reduction of \$2,766 (88%) from the hypothetical no-Proposal A tax bill.

In fact, statewide property taxes for school operations totaled over \$5.6 billion in the year before Proposal A, 1993-94. Ten years later, total school operating taxes are 29% below that level, or slightly less than \$4.0 billion. If no changes had occurred, property owners would be paying over \$12.6 billion today for school operations, more than triple what is actually being collected.

Statewide data show the steadily growing gap between SEV and taxable value. <u>Figure 1</u> below graphs this difference, which was at 22% for FY 2002-03.





It is noteworthy that when property changes ownership, the gap that exists between the capped growth in taxable value and the uncapped growth in SEV is eliminated. The new property owner pays taxes based upon the SEV of the property for the first year; then yearly changes in the property's taxable value again are capped, while the SEV grows according to market forces. This produces an incentive for homeowners not to sell, since they are reaping a benefit of Proposal A in capped taxable values. Before Proposal A, "empty-nesters" often sold their homes and purchased smaller ones; now, this phenomenon may not occur as frequently since buying a different home means, all else being equal, higher taxes. A lack of housing turnover sometimes is cited as one of the causes of declining enrollment in a school district, which translates to fewer operational dollars flowing into the district. Statewide, however, the property market is strong.

With the decline in property taxes, many people also experienced a decline in (or possible elimination of) their homestead property tax credit on their income tax bill. This credit is based on a formula: In order to qualify, property taxes must exceed 3.5% of household income (for nonseniors). Qualifiers receive a credit equal to 60% of the amount of property taxes paid above 3.5% of income. The homestead property tax credit is capped at \$1,200 and the credit is phased out for taxpayers with incomes between \$73,650 and \$82,650. Statewide totals on the homestead tax credit declined by nearly 60% when Proposal A occurred, from just over \$1.0 billion in FY 1993-94 to \$429 million in FY 1994-95. (In FY 2002-03, due to increasing property tax bills, homestead credits claimed totaled just over \$700 million.) On the other hand, with Proposal A, the income tax rate declined from 4.6% to 4.4%. (Subsequent amendments have reduced the income tax to 4.0% today, and 3.9% beginning July 1, 2004.)

Businesses did not receive as extreme a tax break on school property taxes as homeowners did, but mills were reduced nonetheless. Business owners pay, in most cases, 24 mills on the taxable value of the property. Therefore, business owners have seen, on average, a reduction of nine mills and a capping of the value on which a business may be taxed.

Revenue generated from property taxes has performed very well, especially in recent years, when compared with sales and income taxes. Therefore, it stands to reason that if property taxes were still the basis for school operating revenue, most districts likely would be better off. <u>Figure 2</u> below shows the booming growth rates in the State education tax (six mills levied on all property) and the real estate transfer tax versus the more moderate growth rates in the sales and income taxes.

#### **PART V: CONCLUSION**

While most school districts fare more poorly under Proposal A than if no change in the funding of schools had occurred, property owners have reaped the benefits of smaller property tax bills for school district operations, which have contributed to housing accessibility and the boom in Michigan's real estate market. One downside to pre-Proposal A funding for school districts was the reliance on the often unpredictable nature of millage elections to determine the districts operating revenue and budgets; now, that dependence has been virtually eliminated and a more stable source of revenue exists.

Looking at the larger taxation picture, property taxes are not the only taxes that were affected by Proposal A. The sales tax increased from 4% to 6%, which affects all consumers, not just property owners. The use tax also increased from 4% to 6%. The cigarette tax was increased once with Proposal A and again in 2002. (Also, the Governor's recommended budget for FY 2004-05 relies, in part, upon a \$.75 per pack increase in the cigarette tax.) Under Proposal A, the ultimate tax bundle faced by each Michigan resident will vary, therefore, based upon property ownership, income, and consumption of goods.

Given the political pressure from the high levels of property taxes in 1993 that led to Proposal A, it is unlikely that some change would not have happened over the last 10 years given the strong growth in SEV, which would have driven property taxes even higher. Also, declining revenue over the last four years has placed increasing pressure on the General Fund grant to the K-12 budget. Certainly, it is questionable whether the level of GF commitment to the education budget could have continued at the 1993-94 level if Proposal A had not occurred and the budget still relied heavily on this funding source.

With a finite amount of resources, one segment "wins" while another "loses". In this case, home owners win big with respect to lower tax bills for school operations (and owners of business property or second homes also see lower tax bills, although not generally of the magnitude that primary home owners experience). School districts, on the other hand, receive less operating revenue under the current system. The answer to the question, "Are we better off with Proposal A?" unmistakably reflects who "we" are defined to be.

#### PART VI: APPENDIX OF DETAILED ASSUMPTIONS

The information below supplements that given in **Part II: The Assumptions**.

- School districts' 1993-94 State Aid payments were individually inflated by a percent that reflected an estimate of available revenue if changes due to Proposal A had not occurred. This percentage is a combination of the same GF percentage contribution to K-12 in 2003-04 as in 1993-94 and the actual growth rate in the School Aid Fund from 1993-94 through 2003-04, if the sources of revenue flowing into the SAF had not been changed by Proposal A. For example, the sales tax was assumed to remain at 4%, and the additional 2% dedicated to the SAF under current law was not included in the hypothetical scenario.
- The January 2004 State Aid payment was used as the basis for the actual current-year payments to districts' data. Actual current-year local revenue was derived from January 2004 Status Report taxable value, adjusted slightly in anticipation of revisions in the data as they move from Form A to Form C.
- For the analysis holding pupils constant, the Department of Education recalculated the January 2004 State Aid payment using the 1993-94 pupil membership blends.
- Michigan Residential True Cash Value Growth from 1994 through 2004 was provided by the Department of Treasury, and was applied to the hypothetical owner of a home valued at \$100,000 before Proposal A to determine its State equalized valuation in 2004. The 2004 growth rate is estimated at 7.0%. Taxable value of this hypothetical home was determined in the first year after Proposal A by applying the consumer price index (CPI) to one-half of the starting market value, then applying CPI changes yearly thereafter (since CPI increase has been less than 5% each year since Proposal A).
- "Headlee" rollbacks for millage rates are required under Article IX, Section 31 of the State Constitution. This section requires mills assessed on a growing property base to be reduced in order to yield the same revenue as on the prior base, adjusted for inflation.
- Data for the graph titled: "Growing Gap Between SEV and Taxable Value" can be found in Table 5.
